B7 Parents Evening - Wednesday 5 February

Parents and boys are invited into school for the Year 7 Parents Evening taking place from 5.50pm on 5 February. Five minute appointments with teachers need to be booked in advance and you can choose up to ten subjects/teachers to book with. English, Maths and Science teachers will be based in classrooms 1-8 (i.e. the English & Maths classrooms in the newly refurbished Jubilee wing, **NOT** the Science block) as shown in this map. Booking opens at 7am on Tuesday 28 January via schoolcloud and you should use your son's full name, as the system does not recognise abbreviated names. Please select to book **manually** (not automatically) so that you can leave 5 minute gaps as 'travel time' to move between the Sports Hall and Classrooms as required. If you are unable to book with one of the ten teachers you have prioritised to see, please email them directly with any questions you may have. Booking will close at 7am on Tuesday 4 February.

On the night please do not drive into school until after 5.40pm by which time all the school coaches should have safely departed. Your son can remain at school and meet up with you when you arrive. Please make your way to the sports hall to sign in and refreshments will also be available here. Whilst we will do our best to keep the evening running to time, inevitably there will need to be some flexibility throughout the evening, so please do bear with us. Teachers have been asked to see parents in the order they have booked where possible and keep appointments within their five minute timings. Therefore if you find a longer conversation is needed, please continue this at a later date. The evening is scheduled to finish by 8pm.

Root of the Week

A reminder about 'Root of the Week' where pupils learn one new word root and its meaning each week, along with examples of words containing that root in an attempt to increase vocabulary and comprehension.

- The root this week was 'Post' meaning 'after or behind'
- Example words: postpone, postmortem, postscript, postseason, postgraduate

Post

Origin: Latin

Meaning: After or behind

Examples: Postpone Postmortem Postscript Postseason Postgraduate

Words of the Term

- It has been widely researched that one of the stumbling blocks for teenagers is literacy. A teenager with a 2000 word vocabulary is able to access 73% of academic literature, a 5000 word vocabulary 83% of academic literature.
- However it has also been found through research that a pupil with a 2000 word vocabulary in addition to the 570 words identified through research as the Academic Word List can access 95% of academic literature.
- The <u>Spring term Academic Words</u> are shown below and pupils have a copy of these words inside their exercise books. Please support your son to familiarise himself with these words, as well as comprehend and use them in the correct context.
